About Common Europe

COMMON EUROPE, an IT user community of IBM based solutions, is an umbrella organization of European national IBM Power SystemsTM, IBM iTM, AIXTM, and LinuxTM user groups.

The aims and purpose of Common Europe are to:

- Encourage members to exchange experience and information related to the use of IT.
- Offer its members advanced education and training in IT.
- Influence IBM's strategy for product development and service levels through a formal Requirements Process.
- Encourage an ongoing, open dialogue between members and IBM.
- Influence the setting of international standards in the interest of its membership.

As an umbrella organisation, Common Europe is committed to support its member countries, in achieving their mission at the national level. Specifically, the umbrella organisation supports contacts with, and access to, the international level of the worldwide economy today. IT is the area that is vital to the success of nations and of individual companies alike, and should be represented internationally.

Think Globally, Act Locally Members of Common Europe may participate in activities at thier country level and through Common Europe, at an international level. Within the country, members often need fast and easy solutions to daily problems, and where communicating in ones native language is often easier. Only a local, national structure can offer this facility.

Moreover, these activities can cater to the national culture and flavour. Depending on the geography and on the economic situation, the activities offered in the various countries do vary. Large countries often organise conferences of two or more days with exhibitions and multi stream agendas, while smaller countries might prefer something smaller.

At the European level, the official language is English. Once a year, Common Europe organises an international congress in one of the member countries, and members from all countries are invited.

Certification

Attaining certification signals to the world that you are an expert at what you do. It validates your skills against current practices. This can be a real boost to your career as many companies value certified professionals.

Contact your local user group for more information regarding certifications.







This is the certification you want to attain if you are just entering the working world or within a few years after starting your first job. With several years of work experience, you have developed an understanding of how IT fits within the bigger picture at your company. This deeper understanding of IT and business synergy means that you are ready for this level of certification.

If you are actively using RPG in your job, this is the certification for you. Finding people with current RPG skills can be difficult for employers. This technical certification shows that you are capable of doing the job.

What is CEAC?

CEAC is a technical advisory council consisting of a representative sample of end user members from one of the Common Europe organisations. It is used as a forum for a dialogue with IBM on strategic and long term issues.

As with almost every company in the world IBM has a limited R & D budget and it wants to ensure that it invests these funds in areas that its customers want. CEAC has been established to help them find the optimum balance between customer requirements and its business investment.

Through CEAC, Common Europe members have a direct link to IBM and the ability to get their voice heard with regards to new requirements and needs for the IBM i platform. They will also receive an advanced insight into the future direction of the platform and find out about new functions, technologies and directions for the platform before they are publicly announced

MEMBERS

CEAC members are IT professionals with extensive IBM i experience, visionary ideas and business knowledge from a wide range of business sectors. Their main task is to give IBM open, honest and constructive feedback on strategic directions, feature set, current shortfalls and potential new requirements for the IBM i platform.

In addition they agree to actively seek out and gather new requirements for IBM i from COMMON Europe members (usually in their own local geography) and present these through monthly conference calls and face-to-face (F2F) meetings.

To be a member of CEAC you need to be member of one of the Common Europe country organisations. It is required that all members are able to speak and write in English. Members are encouraged to stay for a minimum of 3-5 years, so as to be able to learn, participate and see results.

CEAC aims to be a group of about 15 members, the majority of who work in customer sites, rather than IBM Business Partners (BP) or Independent Software Vendors (ISV). Any new applicant can apply for CEAC membership through their countries organization or be recommended by a current CEAC member.

All members of CEAC have to sign a None Disclosure Agreement (NDA) with IBM to be able to get the strategic information from IBM, open answers and discussions regarding requirements. Any member that repeatedly fails to attend face to face meetings or monthly conference calls may be released from membership.

IBM has two other customer groups similar to CEAC, Common America Advisory Council (CAAC) and Large User Group (LUG), members can be invited to join other groups meetings as a guest.

ORGANISATION

CEAC is a part of Common Europe (CE) and to maintain communication with the CE Board of Directors and IBM the CEAC has a designated liaison within IBM.

Membership of CEAC is on a voluntary basis and as such members do not get paid. However, Common Europe will pay for 1 night's hotel accommodation for the F2F meetings.

IBM HAISON

IBM has a dedicated contact assigned as a liaison to the CEAC. Their role is to plan, facilitate and host the monthly CEAC meetings. In addition, during meetings, their role is to capture any actions and updates involving IBM and to make sure that IBM is responding to Requirements / questions a proper and timely fashion and that the right persons from IBM are asked to attend monthly and F2F meetings.

CEAC members can contact the IBM liaison directly between meetings if they have questions for IBM or need to follow up on a specific Requirement.
